

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# **Eligibility for honors**

All are welcome to attend and participate in our services, regardless of ethnicity or religion. In keeping with tradition, aliyot, and most of the other ritual honors during the service may only be performed by Jewish people. As our congregation affiliates with the Conservative Movement of Judaism, the designation "Jewish" for all ritual purposes applies only to someone born to a Jewish (biological) mother, or someone who has undergone a formal conversion ceremony in keeping with our movement's standards. If in doubt, or if you have specific concerns about this, please speak to the rabbi well in advance.

While most of the honors can only be performed by Jewish people, we have special honors for non-Jewish family members and guests as well. This is especially encouraged if a parent or grandparent happens to not be Jewish. If this is relevant, please specify in "Other requests" at the end of this form.


#### Aliyot

- Please list honorees in order of importance to be honored.
- The actual order of the aliyot will be determined by the rabbi and/or gabbai.
- Families typically assign **up to five** of the seven aliyot, with the remaining two aliyot reserved for other congregants marking important occasions that week. Individual circumstances often differ, though, and the rabbi will do his best to accommodate your particular preferences.
- As an egalitarian congregation, we ask that, as much as possible, an equal number of women and men be honored with aliyot.
- It is our proudly egalitarian policy to call people up by both their father's and their mother's name. Please include both whenever possible.
- If a Hebrew name is not known, the English name is used.
